WORLD HEPATITIS DAY CELEBRATION 2026

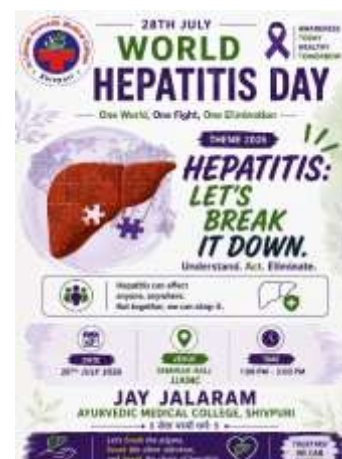

On the occasion of **World Hepatitis Day**, the Department of Kayachikitsa organized a Hepatitis Awareness Programme which includes e-poster presentation and Speech on 28th July 2026 at Seminar Hall, JJAMC. The program was conducted with the objective of spreading awareness about Hepatitis prevention, early detection, and the importance of timely treatment.

The program commenced with **Deep Pragatyā (lamp lighting ceremony)**, symbolizing the light of knowledge and hope in the fight against Hepatitis. Faculty members, respected teachers, and students of the JJAMC participated in the ceremony.

After the inauguration, Faculty of Kayachikitsa department delivered insightful speech highlighting:

- Different types of viral hepatitis, modes of transmission, common clinical manifestations, complications, preventive measures, and the importance of early diagnosis.
- Special emphasis was given to hepatitis B and C, their routes of transmission, availability of vaccination for hepatitis B, and the role of screening and treatment in preventing long-term complications such as cirrhosis and hepatocellular carcinoma.
- Contribution of Ayurveda in management of Hepatitis and prevention of the same.

Then Final year students gave their speeches on the same. They also discussed:

- The importance of breaking the stigma associated with hepatitis. Participants were encouraged to spread correct information and avoid discrimination against individuals affected by hepatitis. The role of healthcare professionals in creating awareness, promoting preventive practices, encouraging screening, and supporting patients was also highlighted.

- The importance of public awareness campaigns in rural and urban areas.

Then e-poster presentations were done by the students.

The programme focused on the message **“One World, One Fight, One Elimination”** and the theme **“Hepatitis: Let’s Break It Down.”** The session highlighted that hepatitis can affect anyone and emphasized the importance of awareness, preventive measures, timely testing, vaccination, safe practices, and appropriate medical care.

The program concluded with a vote of thanks, appreciating the efforts of the organizing committee, faculty members, and students for making the event successful. The celebration served as a meaningful step toward spreading awareness and reinforcing the message that together we can fight Hepatitis with proper prevention and treatment.

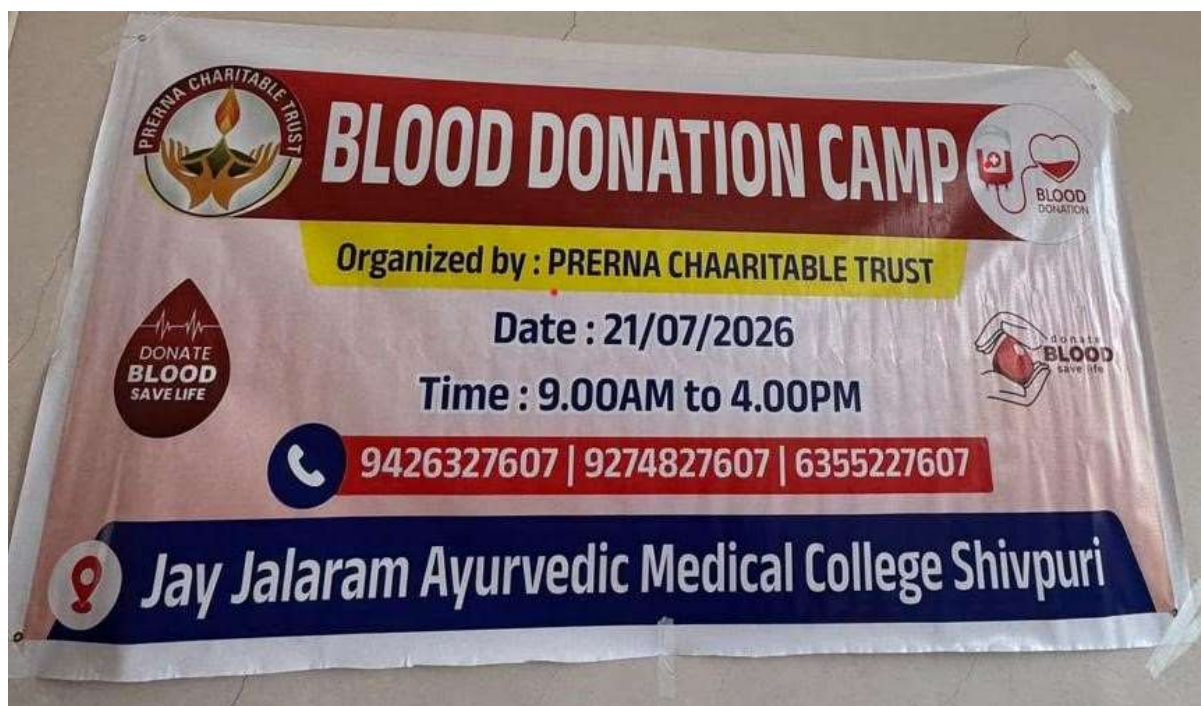
